



# Flu Vaccine

## ***What can it do?***

Reduce the risk of severe flu-related illness by 40%–60%.

## ***Who is eligible?***

Everyone ages 6 months and older.

## ***When to get immunized?***

Fall, ideally by the end of October.

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# COVID-19 Vaccine

## *What can it do?*

Significantly reduce the risk of severe COVID-19.

## *Who is eligible?*

Most people over 6 months old are eligible for the vaccine series or a booster.

## *When to get immunized?*

Immediately, if never vaccinated. Otherwise, consult with a healthcare provider about a booster dose.

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# RSV Immunization for Infants

## *What can it do?*

Reduce the risk of hospitalization and healthcare visits for RSV in infants by about 80%.

## *Who is eligible?*

All infants age 8 months and under and high-risk infants ages 8 to 19 months.

## *When to get immunized?*

Once the vaccine is available this fall.

# RSV Vaccine for Pregnant People

## ***What can it do?***

Reduce the risk of infant  
hospitalization by about 70%.

## ***Who is eligible?***

People between 24 and 36 weeks  
of pregnancy.

## ***When to get immunized?***

Once the vaccine is available this fall.  
If a pregnant person is vaccinated between  
24 and 36 weeks, they will pass protection  
to the baby for their first six months of life.

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# **RSV Vaccine for Older Adults**

## ***What can it do?***

Protect against severe disease  
by over 80%.

## ***Who is eligible?***

Adults over age 60.

## ***When to get immunized?***

Immediately, ideally by  
the end of October.
