# What is the Medical Reserve Corps?

The Medical Reserve Corps is a group consisting of healthcare professionals and support staff who in the event of a public health emergency, can respond and carry out their duties. The New Jersey Department of Health and Human Services realizes that in an event of emergency, people are our most valuable asset.



## WHAT KINDS OF VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED?

All members of the community are encouraged to volunteer their skills and knowledge as long as they are a U.S citizen and 18 years of age or older, including:

- Physicians/ Physician's Assistants
- Nurses (RN, LPN, NP)
- Dentists
- Social Workers/ Mental Health
- Pharmacists
- EMT's and First Responders
- Veterinarians
- Communication Specialists
- Language Interpreters
- Administrative/Support Staff
- Students in The Health Field

## WHAT YOU WILL DO AS A VOLUNTEER?

Volunteers will participate in training and educational exercises in order to be prepared in the event of an emergency.

### *TYPES OF TRAININGS INCLUDE:*

- CS and NIMS Training
- CBRNE Awareness
- CPR
- First Aid
- Point of Distribution (POD)
- Family Disaster Training

During a public health emergency, volunteers can perform duties in relation to their training, interests, or experience such as direct patient care, administrative duties, reception services, or translation services.
