# AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A FIVE-YEAR EXTENSION OF THE LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD AND THE CRANFORD CLAY COURTS CLUB, INC.

WHEREAS, the Township of Cranford entered into a lease agreement on March 29, 1999, with the Cranford Clay Courts Club, Inc., a not for profit corporation of the State of New Jersey, with registered offices at 123 North Union Avenue, Cranford, New Jersey, for the lease of premises commonly known as 301 Springfield Avenue, Cranford, New Jersey, all known and designated as Lot 18 in Block 184, on the Tax Map of the Township of Cranford for a five (5) year term ending December 31, 2003 (the "Lease"); and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has since extended the Lease for successive five (5) year terms most recently ending December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford and the Cranford Clay Courts Club, Inc., desires to extend said lease for an additional (5) five-year term; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford:

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-14 and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-15, the Mayor and Township Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into an extension of the lease agreement between the Township of Cranford and the Cranford Clay Courts Club, Inc., a not for profit corporation of the State of New Jersey, for a five-year term ending December 31, 2028, in the form prepared or approved of by the Township Attorney.

**SECTION 2.** In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Township of Cranford, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Cranford are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

**SECTION 3.** If any article, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance and they shall remain in full force and effect.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-04**

### AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT FOR THE SALE OF CRANFORD TOWNSHIP PROPERTY TO PROVIDE AFFORDABLE HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE WITH DEVELOPMENTAL, EMOTIONAL, PHYSICAL, OR SOCIAL DISABILITIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to In re N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97, 221 N.J. 1 (2015) (Mount Laurel IV), the Township filed a complaint on November 21, 2018 under caption In the Matter of the Township of Cranford, County of Union, Docket No. UNN-L-3976-18, seeking, among other things, a judicial declaration that its Housing Element and Fair Share Plan (HEFSP), hereinafter "Fair Share Plan"), satisfies its "fair share" of the regional need for low and moderate income housing pursuant to the Mount Laurel doctrine; and

WHEREAS, on July 25, 2022, the Court entered a Final Judgment of Compliance and Repose finding that the Township's then-applicable HEFSP "is facially constitutionally compliant and provides a fair and reasonable opportunity for the Township to meet" its affordable housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, an element of the Township's HEFSP to satisfy its affordable housing obligations is to create a fair and reasonable opportunity for the development of group housing for people with developmental, emotional, physical or social disabilities; and

WHEREAS, Community Access Unlimited Inc., ("CAU) with an address of 80 West Grand Street, Elizabeth, New Jersey 07202 is a New Jersey non-profit organization organized for the purpose of the education and treatment of person afflicted with developmental disabilities, as well as the provision of education, recreational, medical and social services to residents with developmental, emotional, physical or social disabilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has entered into an agreement with CAU whereby the existing CAU Units will qualify as 6 affordable housing credits in satisfaction of the Township's HEFSP; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the Township's HEFSP, the CAU-Township Agreement further grants CAU an option to develop additional affordable housing credits by acquiring from the Township the real property known as Block 601, Lot 1.01, 104 McClellan Street, for the development of; and

WHEREAS, CAU, through its assignor, Community Property Management of N.J., Inc., intends to develop 104 McClellan Street as a single-story 4-bedroom home for the provision of housing, medical and social services to residents with developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A.40A:12-21(h) & (l), a municipality may authorize the sale of

municipal land not then needed for municipal purposes for nominal consideration to a nonprofit organization for the purpose of treating and housing low and moderate income persons or handicapped persons, subject a right of reverter if said lands are not used in accordance with such purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has determined that 104 McClellan Street is not needed for municipal purposes other than for the creation of housing for the treatment and housing low and moderate income persons or handicapped persons as called for in the Township's HEFSP, and that conveyance of 104 McClellan Street for the creation of such housing is consistent with state law and the Township's HEFSP.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by** the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford:

SECTION 1. The Mayor and Township Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary and proper, including but not limited to a Purchase & Sale Agreement and Deed, for conveying 104 McClellan Street to CAU and/or its assignor Creative Property Management, of NJ, Inc. for nominal consideration for the creation of such housing is consistent with state law and the Township's HEFSP, subject to a right of reverter if said lands are not used in accordance with such purpose.

**SECTION 2.** In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance adany prior ordinance of the Township of Cranford, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Cranford are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-05**

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD, CHAPTER 255 LAND DEVELOPMENT, TO CORRECT THE ZONING OF 102-104 AND 106 SOUTH AVENUE WEST

- **WHEREAS,** the governing body has been delegated the power to zone and adopt a Zoning Ordinance under the Municipal Land Use Law (MLUL) NJSA 40:55D-62; and
- **WHEREAS,** pursuant to NJSA 40:55D-62.1, the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, which is the governing body, possesses the power to maintain the essential land use character of the municipality; and
- **WHEREAS,** prior to the 2009 Master Plan the property known as Block 401, Lots 2 & 3, commonly known as 102-104 and 06 South Avenue (the "Properties") were zoned for the B-3 zone, also known as the Neighborhood Business District; and
- **WHEREAS**, prior to the 2009 Master Plan the only other B-3 zones included the commercial properties along Centennial Avenue south from Lincoln Avenue, all of which in 2009 was rezoned as either Village Commercial ("VC") Zone or Neighborhood Commercial ("NC"); and
- **WHEREAS**, the 2009 Master Plan recommended the creation of the Office Residential Character ("ORC") Zone, to include, *inter alia*, the southside of South Avenue from Lincoln Avenue to Washington Place, but not the northside of South Avenue; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Properties are sited on the northside of South Avenue and not within the area recommended by the Master Plan for zoning as the new ORC Zone; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Properties' current zoning as ORC is inconsistent with the recommendations and changes adopted with the 2009 Master Plan, which recommendation was not altered by the Master Plan Reexamination in 2019;
- WHEREAS, the Township Committee wishes to align the zoning for the Property with the intent and purposes of the Master Plan and found that the change is consistent with the Master Plan's Economic and Non-Residential Goals, including the stated goal to conserve and promote the economic vitality of the Downtown so that the core of Cranford remains healthy, and continue to develop commercial and businesses in the commercial districts; and
- **WHEREAS**, it would be therefore consistent with the Master Plan and its goals to zone the Properties for uses consistent with the other parcels previously zoned B-3, , and which are currently zoned as either rezoned either Village Commercial ("VC") or Neighborhood Commercial ("NC").

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, Union County, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The property identified on the Cranford Tax Map as Block 401, Lots 1 and 2, commonly known as 102-104 and 106 South West Avenue is hereby removed from the Office Residential Character (OCR) District and instead designated as within the Village Commercial ("VC") District.

**SECTION 2.** Chapter 255, Attachment 2 - Zoning Map shall be updated and revised to reflect the Zones and amendments enacted by this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3.** In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Township of Cranford, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Cranford are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD, CHAPTER 93 POLICE DEPARTMENT, SECTION 10 NUMBER OF PERSONNEL

**WHEREAS**, the law enforcement profession is rapidly to respond to community needs, which changes are reflected in policy training, policy, and public transparency; and

WHEREAS, the Cranford Police Department is a leader among its peer departments and has successfully balances a proactive approach to policing and enforcement and community-based programs to maintain the public trust; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chief of Police and Township Committee of the Township of Cranford desire to be proactive in staffing the Cranford Police Department to meet the needs of the community by adding an additional patrol officer to it ranks.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 93, Section 10 is hereby temporarily amended as follows:

### § 93-10 Number of personnel.

The sworn personnel of the Police Department shall consist of the following officers and members which shall not exceed 54 <u>55</u>:

- A. Chief of Police.
- B. Captains: two.
- C. Lieutenants: five.
- D. Sergeants: ten.
- E. Patrol officers: 36 37.

**SECTION 3.** Unless otherwise modified in accordance with the law, the foregoing amendment to Chapter 93, Section 10, shall expire at midnight on December 31, 2024.

EXPLANATION – Matter struck through thus in the above Ordinance is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter underlined thus is new matter.

**SECTION 2.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-07**

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER XVII OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD TO AMEND THE SECTION ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION"

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, within the County of Union and State of New Jersey, as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 223 Fires and Fire Prevention is hereby amended to create Article IV Emergency Cost Recovery as follows:

#### CHAPTER IV EMERGENCY SERVICES COST RECOVERY

### § 223-23 Definitions

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

- a. "Fire Department" shall mean The Township of Cranford Department.
- b. "Person" shall mean a natural person or persons, partnership, corporation, association, firm or other legal entity.
- c. "Responsible Party" shall mean the person having received emergency services provided by the Fire Department.

### § 223-24 Purpose.

The purpose of this article is to provide authority, procedures and requirements to seek collection and reimbursement for the reasonable costs of non-emergency standby and responding to emergency incidents by the Fire Department for fire service calls, hazardous material incidents, environmental incidents, and safety and rescue incidents coordinated via Union County Dispatch and 911 responses, and those that use hazardous material abatement equipment and materials are also eligible for reimbursement.

### § 223-25 Authorization to recover costs and expenses

The governing body of the Township of Cranford authorizes the Fire Department and/or the Township of Cranford to recover the real and reasonable costs incurred for firefighting materials or equipment used and expended; the costs of personnel and the use of fire trucks, fire engines, rescue equipment, and other vehicles; the costs of hazardous situation abatement materials involved in any fire, safety and rescue incident or operation, and hazardous abatement incident, including vehicular accidents or fires.

### § 223-26 Policy for billing.

- a. The Township of Cranford recognizes the Fire Department's need to bill for fire, rescue and hazmat services to aid in the provision of emergency services.
- b. No person requiring emergency services shall be denied services due to lack of insurance or ability to pay.
- c. Rates for equipment used shall be derived from "FEMA's Schedule of Equipment Rates" as issued and amended from time to time by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
  - 1. Rates provided shall be billable per hour with any fractional hour rounded up to the next highest hour.
  - 2. Rates for equipment may be amended by resolution.
- d. Rates for manpower shall be billed at the initial rate of \$50.00 per firefighter per hour with any fractional hour rounded up to the next highest hour and this hourly rate may be amended by resolution.
- e. Any applicable charges for emergency services rendered shall be billed directly to the user of such services or the user's insurance company.
- f. The Township of Cranford and/or the Fire Department may, either directly or through any third-party billing agency with which it has contracted for billing and/or collections for fire, rescue and hazmat services, make arrangements with users of such services and/or their financially responsible party for the installment payment of bills.
- g. The Fire Department shall provide a financial reporting to the Township of Cranford' Chief Financial Officer on a semiannual basis of:
  - 1. The opening balance of funds on hand.
  - 2. Amount of billings issued.
  - 3. Amount of collections in satisfaction of billings issued.
  - 4. A detailed listing of any amounts disbursed, including the vendor and purpose of disbursement.
  - 5. The ending balance of funds on hand.

### § 223-27 Procedure for billing.

- a. The Township of Cranford and/or the Fire Department is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with a third-party billing agency and/or collection agency for the performance of non-emergency, emergency, rescue and hazmat services billing and/or collection services, provided that the following standards for third-party billing are met:
  - 1. The third-party billing service is to be provided at an amount consistent with the fair market value for the services rendered.
  - 2. Neither the billing agency nor any of its employees are subject to exclusion for any user fee.
  - 3. The billing agency is bonded and/or insured in amounts satisfactory to the Township of Cranford.
- b. The Township of Cranford and/or the Fire Department may, at its discretion, bill additionally for material and vehicle costs in the case of any malicious false call or alarm or for any major, extraordinary or unique incidents, including, but not limited to,

hazardous material spills, fire emergency and rescue incidents that destroy or severely damage emergency services equipment.

### c. User fees.

- 1. Fire and rescue services shall initiate user fees for the delivery of emergency services, supplies and equipment to the scene of any hazardous material incident, environmental incident or safety and rescue incident or operation, including vehicular accidents and fires that occur and are responded to by the Fire Department.
- 2. Every person and/or utility that is provided with non-emergency, emergency, rescue and hazmat services shall be billed a user fee in accordance with this article.
- 3. The user fee for emergency services rendered shall be billed directly to the user of such services' insurance company. If the insurance company is not known, the user of services shall be billed directly, with instructions to forward the bill to his/her insurance provider.
- 4. Any and all amounts collected as a result of this article shall be used exclusively for the replacement or maintenance of Fire Department emergency services materials, equipment and training and shall be held in trust by the Township's Chief Financial Officer for that purpose.
- 5. The Township of Cranford may implement rules and/or regulations and/or revoke or amend existing rules and/or regulations as may be deemed necessary for the billing and/or collection and use of user fees pursuant to this article.

### d. Uncollectable accounts.

- 1. The user fee is anticipated to be paid by the user's insurance company. In the instance where the Township of Cranford and/or the Fire Department receives notification from the insurance carrier that it will not honor the invoice, the Township of Cranford and/or Fire Department is authorized to invoice the responsible party directly and take any legal action necessary to collect the fee(s), including negotiating a settlement.
- 2. The Township of Cranford and/or Fire Department may, at its discretion, write off the uncollected fee amounts as a bad debt, without prejudice to the responsible party.
- 3. Should the Township of Cranford and/or Fire Department determine that an insurance carrier has remitted the fee to the responsible party involved and that the party has failed to remit the fee, the Township of Cranford and/or Fire Department are authorized to pursue all legal means and appropriate action in order to collect the account.

### § 223-28 Saving Clause.

Nothing in this article shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy or any character be lost, impaired or affected by this article.

**SECTION 2.** In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Township of Cranford, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Cranford are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

**SECTION 3.** If any article, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance and they shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 4.** This ordinance will take effect upon publication after final passage as required by law.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-08**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, CHAPTER 40, ARTICLE V, SECTION 28 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES TRANSPORT FEES

WHEREAS, the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "Township"), established a Division of Medical Services in the Fire Department for the provision of emergency medical service; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 40, Article V, Section 28 sets forth various fees for Emergency Management Services (EMS) Transport; and

WHEREAS, those fees have not been increased in more than a decade; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the Township to update those fees; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, that §40-28 of the Code of the Township of Cranford is hereby amended as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 40, Article V, Section 28 is hereby amended as follows:

### §40-28 Emergency medical services transport fees.

There is hereby established a fee schedule for emergency medical services transport by the Township of Cranford as follows:

- A. The base rate shall be \$1,000\$850 per transport. The rate shall include the services of two emergency medical technicians and emergency ambulance transportation services to any Hospital Emergency Department.
- B. For any transport to any health-care facility in addition to the base rate, a mileage charge of \$30.00\frac{\$25.00}{25.00} per mile, with a minimum standard charge of one (1) mile shall apply.

EXPLANATION – Matter struck through thus in the above ordinance is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter underlined thus is a new matter.

C. The Fire Chief or Township Administrator is authorized to waive the charge for such services for any resident lacking insurance coverage for such services and is further authorized to waive uninsured co-payments and deductibles for such residents.

**SECTION 2.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 3.** All ordinances of the Township of Cranford that are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 4.** Upon final passage and publication according to law, this ordinance shall become effective immediately.



### RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR LEGISLATION TO ESTABLISH MINIMUM REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE STAFFING STANDARDS

WHEREAS, a one (1)-patient increase in a nurse's workload increased the likelihood of an inpatient death within thirty (30) days of admission by seven (7) per cent (%); and

WHEREAS, mortality risk decreases by nine (9) per cent (%) for Intensive Care Unit (ICU) patients and sixteen (16) per cent (%) for surgery patients with the increase of one FTE (fulltime) RN (Registered Nurse) per patient day; and

WHEREAS, nurse staffing shortages are a factor in one (1) out of every four (4) unexpected hospital deaths or injuries caused by errors; and

WHEREAS, a 2021 study published in the American Journal of Infection Control found that each additional sepsis patient per nurse was associated with nineteen (19) per cent (%) higher odds of in-hospital mortality; and

WHEREAS, a study of New York hospitals in 2021 showed significant decreases in patient deaths would occur if patient care was limited to a ratio of four (4) patients to one (1) nurse: four thousand three hundred and seventy (4,370) deaths would have been avoided in New York just among Medicare patients during the two (2)-year study; and

WHEREAS, understaffing at hospitals, ambulatory surgery facilities, State developmental centers and psychiatric hospitals have been demonstrated to be an underlying cause of the current nursing shortage as higher patient assignments create higher levels of job dissatisfaction, burnout and turnover rates among nurses;

WHEREAS, Mount Laurel II and its progeny generated substantial litigation culminating in the enactment of the New Jersey Fair Housing Act in 1985 ("FHA"); and

### The Fair Housing Act of 1985

WHEREAS, the Legislature enacted the FHA to restore home rule, to allow municipalities to plan for their Mount Laurel compliance in a manner consistent with the municipal Master Plan, known as home rule; and

WHEREAS, the FHA brought balance to Mount Laurel compliance by imposing a moratorium on the builder's remedy and by providing an administrative process that municipalities could voluntarily pursue wherein they would be insulated from developers seeking builder's remedies to try to compel them to capitulate their zoning demands; and

WHEREAS, the FHA intended for municipal fair share numbers to be based on a transparent, predictable, and empirical-based methodology by among other things defining the prospective need as the need "based on development and growth which is reasonably likely to occur" and by creating mechanisms for creating affordable housing consistent with sound planning in municipalities that were fully or near fully-developed and lacked sufficient land to satisfy the obligation generated by the fair share formula; and

**WHEREAS**, the FHA sought *to reduce the burdens on municipalities* by prohibiting any requirement for municipalities to expend their own resources to comply; and

### The New Jersey Council on Affordable Housing

**WHEREAS**, the FHA created COAH and conferred "primary jurisdiction" on COAH to administer the FHA and to implement the affordable housing policies of our State; and

WHEREAS, all acknowledge -- even Fair Share Housing Center ("FSHC") -- that COAH functioned just fine in Rounds 1 and 2; and

WHEREAS, COAH did not adopt valid regulations for Round 3 despite multiple efforts to do so and made no efforts to cure the bottleneck the third time COAH voted 3-3 on Round 3 regulations; and

#### Mount Laurel IV

**WHEREAS**, in 2015, the Supreme Court issued a decision, commonly referred to as Mount Laurel IV, in response to a motion to transfer the responsibilities of COAH back to the courts in light of COAH's failure to adopt valid regulations; and

WHEREAS, in Mount Laurel IV, the Supreme Court returned the task of implementing the doctrine back to the Courts because COAH had failed to do its job and made no effort to cure the roadblock when it voted 3-3 on the third iteration of Round 3 regulations; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the foregoing, the Court emphasized that it preferred the administrative remedy created by the FHA to a judicial one and hoped that COAH would be effective so that towns could comply once again through the administrative process created by the FHA; and

WHEREAS, the Court process proved to be far more expensive than the COAH process and was ill-suited for resolving comprehensive planning disputes over affordable housing matters; and

WHEREAS, the Round 3 process undermined the purposes of the FHA in that it created unpredictable and inconsistent results, created additional burdens and expenses on municipalities, and increased the likelihood that municipal fair share plans would be inconsistent with the State Master Plan and municipal Master Plans; and

WHEREAS, ultimately, on March 8, 2018, after a 41-day trial in Mercer County, the Superior Court, Chancery Division issued an opinion which set forth a fair share methodology; and

WHEREAS, in that trial and in various other instances throughout the state, FSHC took the position that the Statewide obligation should exceed 300,000 to be addressed between 2015 and 2025; and

WHEREAS, municipalities, through Dr. Robert Powell, presented evidence that, in a best case scenario, the State could only absorb less than 40,000 affordable units and thus argued that FSHC's calculations was not grounded in reality whatsoever; and

WHEREAS, the Court, having been constrained by the Supreme Court to prescriptively utilize a formula from 1993, ultimately concluded that the Statewide obligation to be constructed between 2015-2025 was roughly 153,000 units; and

### The 354 Settlements with FSHC

WHEREAS, FSHC reports that it entered 354 settlements in Round 3; and

WHEREAS, many municipalities are reeling under the burden of satisfying their obligations under those settlements entered between 2015 and 2023; and

WHEREAS, many of those Round 3 settlements will result in development during the Round 4 period; and

WHEREAS, Round 4 is set to begin on July 1, 2025 and there is no comprehensive analysis on the impacts of the 354 Round 3 settlements and over-zoning described above; and

WHEREAS, indeed, the A4/S50 Bill fails to consider the impact from affordable housing projects that were approved during the Third Round, but are still not yet under construction, as said projects, as well as additional future projects, will impact legitimate public concerns like infrastructure, the environment, schools, traffic, parking and open space; and

#### A-4/S-50

WHEREAS, the Township of Cranford has grave concerns regarding the proposed legislation to reform the State's Mount Laurel compliance mechanisms for Round 4; and

WHEREAS, the Bill creates a judicial entity made up of 3-7 retired Mount Laurel judges called "The Program", which, unlike COAH, is not comprised of an equal number of municipal and housing representatives, and is not made up of an equal number of Republicans and Democrats, thereby depriving the citizens of our State of the carefully crafted COAH Board that included a diversity of interests and that was the centerpiece of the FHA adopted in 1985; and

WHEREAS, the Bill still does not require the promulgation of affordable housing obligations, or the adoption of substantive regulations, in a way that utilizes an open and transparent process that COAH used and that gave all interested parties an opportunity to comment and receive COAH's response to their comments; and

WHEREAS, the Bill presumes that 40 percent of all new households will qualify as low or moderate by subtracting the number of households reported in the 2010 Decennial Census from the number of households reported in the 2020 Decennial Census and multiplying that figure by 40 percent; and

WHEREAS, the Bill still fails to account for the costs and impact on municipalities and the State by virtue of the 354 Round 3 settlements entered into only in the past few years; and

WHEREAS, the Bill requires municipalities to create a realistic opportunity for satisfaction of a fair share without taking into account how many affordable units can realistically be achieved through traditional inclusionary zoning (where generally one out of every five units must be affordable); and

WHEREAS, as explained below, the bill dilutes the protections to which a municipality is currently entitled as it seeks to comply voluntarily and even after it secures approval of its affordable housing plan; and

WHEREAS, current law preserves a municipality's immunity in the absence of proof that the municipality is "determined to be constitutionally noncompliant", the proposed bill does not give municipalities seeking to comply voluntarily the same measure of protection the Supreme Court deemed appropriate; and

WHEREAS A4/S50 subjects municipalities to litigation not only as they seek approval of their Housing Element and Fair Share Plans, but also even after they secure approval of those plans; and

WHEREAS, more specifically, A4/S50 provides municipalities a "compliance certification" if the municipality secures approval of its affordable housing plan; however, that certification does not prevent an interested party from "alleging that, despite the issuance of compliance certification, a municipality's fair share obligation, fair share plan, housing element, or ordinances implementing the fair share plan or housing element are in violation of the Mount Laurel doctrine"; and

WHEREAS, under current laws, a municipality would have a right to rely on the fair share number that COAH provides; however, under the new bill a municipality would only have a presumption of validity that the number the DCA provides to the municipality is appropriate and FSHC, a deep pocketed developer or any other interested party could seek to overcome that presumption through litigation; and

WHEREAS, the A4/S50 Bill replaces a straightforward system by which a municipality could secure bonus credits up to a 25 percent cap with a highly complicated system for securing bonuses with many conditions attached to various forms of bonus.; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature previously capped the fair share of any municipality down to 1,000 in recognition that any obligation above 1,000 would be "onerous"; A4/S50 applies the 1,000-unit cap only to a component of the municipality's fair share -- the prospective need – and authorizes the imposition of an obligation that is onerous; and

WHEREAS, the A4/S50 Bill creates unfair requirements and ambiguity when it comes to the Vacant Land Adjustment process, which could lead to municipalities that lack sufficient vacant land being required to produce more affordable housing units than is practical; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Cranford is concerned that the Bill will lead to over development is inconsistent with its Master Plan and the State Master Plan, and affordable housing that is not smartly planned nor well suited for the needs of New Jerseys low- and moderate-income families, and will lead to increased taxes, and excessive burdens on our schools, public services, roads, sewer and water infrastructure.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that for all of the above reasons, the Township of Cranford, objects to and opposes Assembly Bill No. 4/Senate Bill No. 50, and requests that the bill be tabled, re-written and re-introduced in way that imposes achievable obligations and facilitates the ability of the municipality to satisfy its obligations.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** a certified copy of this resolution shall be sent to the Legislators in the State Assembly and Senate representing our District immediately.
