ORDINANCE NO. 2022-20

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF
UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO ADDRESS THE
IMPROPER HOME COMPOSTING THAT CREATES A
NUISANCE FOR NEIGHBORS AND MUST BE ABATED**

WHEREAS, the Township Committee, Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "Township"), recognizes that proper composting by residents benefits the community; and

WHEREAS, the beneficial impact of composting can be undermined when compost materials are improperly stored on residential properties, which can create a nuisance to the neighborhood and attract insects, vermin, and rodents; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford desires to provide residents with information on the benefits of composting, including the proper methods for storage and use of composting materials; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford wishes to enact regulations for the proper storage of compost materials on residential properties to encourage composting while preventing improper composting from creating nuisance conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, that Chapter 232, Garbage, Rubbish and Refuse be amended as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 232, Garbage and Refuse, shall be amended by the creation of Article V entitled "Residential Composting" as follows:

§ 232-30 Definitions.

COMPOSTING shall mean the controlled decomposition of organic matter to make compost. Compost improves soil structure and moisture retention and provides plants with nutrients.

NUISANCE shall mean the creation of a condition that negatively impacts a neighborhood by attracting insects, rodents, and vermin as well as generating offensive odors.

PUTRESCIBLE shall mean waste composed of or comprising some portion of animal, vegetable or other organic matter that is capable of decay or decomposition during storage or awaiting collection, such as food or food products or animal waste, that will create offensive odors or

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liquids and be food for rodents, vermin, and insects or otherwise create a nuisance if not properly stored.

YARD GROWTH/WASTE shall mean leaves, grass, clippings, small brush and lawn rakings, compost, and any other similar yard waste generated from the property.

§ 232-31 Residential storage of composting material

All composting material must be stored a minimum of 10 feet from each property line and in a manner to prevent offensive odors from migrating to adjoining property owners as well as attracting insects, rodents, and vermin (nuisance to the neighborhood.)

§ 232-32. Periodic inspections; reports.

- A. Inspections of lots and lands in the Township shall be made from time to time by the Health Officer of the Township to ascertain whether conditions exist in violation of this article.
- B. When the Health Officer finds that removal of the substances and conditions described in § 294-4 from the lot or land is necessary, the Health Officer shall make a report thereof to the Police Department.

§ 232-33. Notice to abate or remove; service of notices.

- A. Upon receipt of the report mentioned in § 232-32 or upon their own initiative, the Health Officer shall cause a ten-day notice to be given to the owner, lessee or occupant of such lot or land to remove the conditions and substances within the ten-day period.
- B. The notice to abate the conditions shall be in writing and shall be served upon a resident of the Township personally or by leaving it at their usual place of abode and shall be served upon a nonresident of the Township by mailing the same to their last known address as shown by the tax records.

§ 232-34. Failure to comply; enforcement.

In case the owner, lessee or occupant of any lot or land who is served with the notice described in § 232-33 fails, neglects or refuses to effect the removal of the conditions and substances as therein demanded within the ten-day period provided in § 232-33, then the Health Officer shall notify the Township Engineer to remove or, under the direction of the Township Engineer through the use of private contractors, cause the removal of the same.

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§ 232-35. Costs and charges.

The Township Engineer shall keep an accurate account of the cost of any such removal and shall certify the cost thereof to the Township Committee. The Committee shall examine the certificate and, if found correct, shall cause the cost as shown therein plus an administration charge of 10% to be charged against said lands. The amount so charged shall forthwith become a lien upon such lands and shall be added to and become and form part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied upon such lot or land. Such amount shall bear interest at the same rate as taxes and shall be collected and enforced by the same officers and in the same manner as taxes.

§ 232-36. Violations and penalties.

- A. Any person who violates any provision of this article shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished as provided in Chapter 1, Article I, of this Code. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
- B. The penalty provisions of Subsection A of this section shall be deemed to be in addition to, and not in substitution of, the provisions of § 232-34 of this article.

SECTION 2. Home Composting. The Township Committee directs the Township Administrator to instruct the Health Department and other Departments, as appropriate, to work with the Green Team to develop and implement a public education program for residents to learn more about the process of home composting and troubleshoot the causes of putrescible waste.

SECTION 3. Severability. If any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to that portion of the ordinance actually invalidated and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

SECTION 4. Determination Of Salaries In Ranges.

Initial placement of employee salaries shall be at or within the aforesaid ranges as recommended by the Township Administrator and approved by the Township Committee. Thereafter, for all positions in Sections 1-3, employees who are not at the maximum salary within the range for their job title shall be eligible for an increase based on their performance until the maximum salary for the position is reached.

All employees will be reviewed by their supervisor in line with the Township Personnel Policy Manual. Unless prohibited under the terms of a collectively bargained agreement or an individual contract, a salary increase, if any, shall be based on the employee's job performance consistent with the table below as recommended by the Township Administrator and approved by the Township Committee.

<u>Performance Rating</u>	<u>Salary Increment</u>
Distinguished: The employee performs well above expected standards, exceeding normal performance standards and expectations in most areas.	3%
Meets Standards: The employee meets the job standards for the position. Progress in developing skills is at an acceptable pace. The employee exhibits no significant problems.	2%
Needs Improvement: The employee is making acceptable progress but needs improvement to meet the performance standards and criteria for the position. Progress is slower than would normally be expected.	1%
Unsatisfactory: The employee's performance is unsatisfactory, job standards are not being met, and major improvement is required.	0%

SECTION 5. Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA)

For all positions in Sections 1-3, except Mayor/Chairperson and Township Committee Member, upon satisfactory job performance and recommendation of the Township Administrator, all employees may be considered for a Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) based on the average yearly percentage increase of Township collectively bargained agreements.

SECTION 6. Temporary Filling of Vacancies

The Township Administrator is authorized to make temporary appointments of part-time or full-time positions to fill vacancies for any positions that are not statutory or department head positions, provided that sufficient funds are available as appropriated by the Township Committee in the Township budget. Positions filled on a part-time basis shall be compensated at the above annual rates converted to hourly rates or pro-rated. The temporary filling of statutory and department head positions shall require the approval of the Township Committee.

SECTION 7. Positions Covered By Collective Bargaining Agreements

Notwithstanding any of the provisions herein, positions covered by a collective bargaining agreement shall be compensated as per the terms of said agreements.

SECTION 8. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-22

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD,
CHAPTER 6, TO CREATE ROBUST CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICIES IN THE
AWARDING OF PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT AND CONTRACTING**

WHEREAS, trust in the local government’s process is an essential component for a strong community;

WHEREAS, in order to maintain confidence in Township government, it is imperative that residents can be assured that Township employment and contracting is free from nepotism, patronage, and favoritism; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the Township retain employees and professionals based on merit, so that residents are assured that the Township is receiving the highest quality service at an honest and fair cost to residents; and

WHEREAS, the system of spending tax payer dollars on salaries, benefits and contracts must be protected from any improper influence that would undermine the public’s confidence in their leaders; and

WHEREAS, any unfair practices of pay to play policies, whether in employment or contracting, will not be tolerated in the community and the integrity of the government protected; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, County of Union, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 6, Article XLIV is hereby amended and retitled as “Conflicts of Interest.”

SECTION 2. Chapter 6, Article XLIV is hereby amended as follows:

§ 6-178 Definitions. As used in this ~~Article~~policy, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

(1) “Appointed Official” means any person whether compensated or not, whether part-time or full-time (1) serving on a Township Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment; or (2)

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who is appointed by the Township as a member of an independent municipal, county or regional authority.

- (2) **“Elected Official”** shall mean the elected members of the Township.
- (3) **“Family member or relative”** shall mean a spouse; child; parent; sibling; father-in-law; mother-in-law; brother-in-law; sister-in-law; stepfather; stepmother; stepsibling; half-brother; half-sister; foster child; domestic partner or cohabitants as defined by the New Jersey Civil Union Act; a person with whom there is a relationship as a legal guardian or *in loco parentis*.
- (4) **“Political Committee”** shall mean any group of two or more persons acting jointly, or any corporation, partnership, or any other incorporated or unincorporated association, including a political club, political action committee, civic association or other organization, which in any calendar year contributes or expects to contribute at least \$6,300 to aid or promote the candidacy of any individual, or the candidacies of individuals, for elective public office.
- (5) **“Candidate Committee”** shall mean any corporation, partnership, or any other incorporated or unincorporated association, organized for purposes of supporting an individual seeking to become an Elected Official.
- (6) **“Contribution”** shall mean a transfer of money or other thing of value, made to, or on behalf of, a Candidate Committee or Political Committee. Included in the definition of a contribution are loans, gifts, subscriptions, real property, and personal property. A contribution may be in the form of currency, check, or other negotiable instrument. A contribution may also be a nonmonetary or “in-kind” contribution.
- (7) **“Party Committee”** shall mean the municipal, county and state Political Committees of the Republican and Democratic parties.

§ 6-179 Disclosure of Personal Interest. Any elected official, municipal official or municipal employee who has or may have any interest, direct or indirect, in any measure, indebtedness or action and who participates in discussion with or gives an official opinion to the Township Committee or to any municipal agency, board or authority with respect thereto shall disclose on the records of the Township Committee or agency, board or authority the nature and extent of such interest. Such personal interests shall be described in writing and filed with the Township Clerk and shall be subject to inspection pursuant to the Open Public Records Law.

§ ~~6-18079~~ Hiring and Supervision of Employees.

(1) No person who is a family member or relative of any Elected Official or the Township Administrator shall be considered for employment as an employee of the Township or for appointment as an Appointed Official. This applies to full-time, part-time, temporary and seasonal employment. This shall not restrict nor prohibit (i.) the continued employment of

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individuals to a position or positions with the Township where a relative of a permanent employee is elected after the date of the permanent employee's start date of employment with the Township; (ii.) the continued employment of individuals employed as of the effective date of this ordinance; or (iii.) the appointment of a family member or relative to a board or committee which performs functions of a purely advisory nature.

(2) No municipal employee shall be in a position that provides direct supervision over any family member or relative of that employee.

(3) One of the purposes of this policy is to assure that the hiring, promotion, responsibilities, oath, obligations to the public, salary, work assignments, performance, appraisals, evaluations or career progress of a person is not affected by that individual's status as a family member or relative of an Elected Official or employee of the Township. These policies are not for the purpose of depriving any citizen of an equal chance for a government job, but solely to eliminate the potential for preferential treatment of the relatives of government personnel or Elected Officials. These policies will not deprive any permanent employee as of the effective date of this ordinance of any promotional right in the normal career development nor change the existing status of any permanent employee. Nothing within this policy shall interfere with a person's right to marry.

(4) The Township reserves the right to exercise, in its sole discretion, with respect to placement, employment, transfer, reassignment or continued employment, where either an actual or perceived conflict of interest exists or will reasonably arise as well as to avoid or decrease the likelihood of sexual or other unlawful harassment in the workplace.

(5) No Elected Official may participate in the hiring of an individual who has, within the 3 years prior, made a Contribution to:

- i.) the Elected Official's Candidate Committee; or
- ii.) a Political Committee that has contributed \$1,000 or more to the Elected Official's Candidate Committee.

§ 6-1810 Promotion of Existing Employees.

(1) No Elected Official or supervisor may participate in the promotion process, or any other personnel decision, of any existing municipal employee who is a family member or relative of such Elected Official or supervisor.

(2) No Elected Official may participate in the promotion process, or any other personnel decision, of any existing municipal employee who has, within the 3 years prior, made a Contribution to:

- i.) the Elected Official's Candidate Committee; or
- ii.) a Political Committee that has contributed \$1,000 or more to the Elected Official's Candidate Committee.

§ 6-1821 Appointments. No family member or relative of an Elected Official or Appointed

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Official shall be appointed to the position of any municipal professional who receives compensation, e.g., attorney, planner or engineer.

§ 6-183 Awarding of public contracts to certain contributors.

(1) Any other provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, the Township or any of its purchasing agents or agencies or those of its independent authorities, as the case may be, shall not enter into an agreement or otherwise contract to procure services from any professional service provider if that provider has solicited or made any Contribution to the Campaign Committee of any candidate for municipal office or Elected Official having ultimate responsibility for the award of the contract, or to any Political Committee that has contributed to any such candidate's or Elected Official's Campaign Committee within one calendar year immediately preceding the date of the contract or agreement.

(2) No professional service provider which enters into negotiations for, or agrees to, any contract or agreement with the Township or any department or agency thereof or of its independent authorities for the rendition of professional, banking or insurance coverage services or any other consulting services shall solicit or make any Contribution to the Campaign Committee of a candidate for municipal office or Elected Official having ultimate responsibility for the award of the contract or to any Political Committee that has contributed to any such candidate's or Elected Official's Campaign Committee between the time of first communications between that business entity and the Township regarding a specific professional services agreement and the later of the termination of negotiations or the completion of the contract or agreement.

(3) No professional service provider shall make a contribution to a Party Committee at least sixty (60) calendar days prior to any Contribution being made by a Party Committee to any Campaign Committee for a Township municipal candidate or Elected Official having ultimate responsibility for the award of a contract.

(4) For purposes of this article, a professional service provider seeking a public contract means an individual including the individual's spouse, if any, and any child living at home; person; firm; corporations; professional corporation; partnership; organization or association. The definition of a business entity includes all principals who own 1% or more of the equity in the corporation or business trust, partners, and officers in the aggregate employed by the entity as well as any subsidiaries directly controlled by the business entity.

(5) For purposes of this section, the office that is considered to have ultimate responsibility for the award of the contract shall be the Township Committee or a public officer who is responsible for the award of a contract if that public officer is appointed by the Township Committee.

§ 6-184 Contributions made prior to the effective date. No contribution of money or any other thing of value, including in-kind contributions, made by a professional service provider to any municipal candidate or Elected Official, or to any Political Committee that has contributed to any such candidate's or Elected Official's Campaign Committee shall be deemed a violation of this section, nor shall an agreement for property, goods, or services of any kind whatsoever be disqualified thereby, if that contribution was made by the professional service provider prior to the effective date of this article.

§ 6-185 Contribution statement by professional business entity.

(1) Prior to awarding any contract or agreement to procure services, including banking or insurance coverage services, with any professional service provider, the Township or any of its purchasing agents or agencies, as the case may be, shall receive a sworn statement from the professional service provider made under penalty of perjury that the bidder or offeror has not made a Contribution in violation of this article.

(2) The professional service provider shall have a continuing duty to report any violations of this article that may occur during the negotiation or duration of a contract. The certification required under this subsection shall be made prior to entry into the contract or agreement with the Township and shall be in addition to any other certifications that may be required by any other provision of law.

§ 6-186 Penalty for Violation.

(1) All Township professional service agreements shall provide that it shall be a breach of the terms of the government contract for a professional service provider, as defined in this article, to violate this article or to knowingly conceal or misrepresent contributions given or received, or to make or solicit contributions through intermediaries, Political Committees, or any Party Committee for the purpose of concealing or misrepresenting the source of the contribution.

(2) Any professional service provider, as defined in this article, who knowingly fails to reveal a contribution made in violation of this article, or who knowingly makes or solicits contributions through an intermediary, including but not limited to a Political Committee or Party Committee, for the purpose of concealing or misrepresenting the source of the contribution, shall be disqualified from eligibility for future Township contracts for a period of four (4) calendar years from the date of the violation.

SECTION 3. Construal of Provisions. Nothing contained in this ordinance shall be interpreted to impair the right of professional service providers, as guaranteed by the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America and further secured by Article 1, Paragraph 6 of the New Jersey Constitution, to exercise the right of freedom of speech.

SECTION 4. Severability. If any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for

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any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to that portion of the ordinance actually invalidated and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 6. Upon final passage and publication according to law, this ordinance shall become effective immediately.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF CRANFORD TO EXPRESSLY PROHIBIT
IN PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP THE
SMOKING, VAPING, OR AEROSOLING OF TOBACCO,
HEMP, CANNABIS AND MARIJUANA**

WHEREAS, both the “Smoke-Free Air Act”, N.J.S.A. 26:3D-55 *et seq.* and N.J.S.A. 2C:33-13 of the New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice, entitled “Smoking in Public,” authorize municipalities to enact ordinances strictly regulating smoking in public places; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee recognizes the well-known and established health and safety risks posed by smoking and second-hand smoke; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has determined that it is within the public interest to prohibit smoking on public property, such as public parks and recreation areas; and

WHEREAS, in 2020 the New Jersey voters approved an amendment to the New Jersey Constitution to legalize the use of cannabis by adults at least 21 years of age; and

WHEREAS, P.L. 2021, c. 16, the Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), regulates the development and enforcement of a recreational cannabis; and

WHEREAS, the Act enables municipalities to enact an ordinance making it unlawful for any person to smoke, vape, or aerosolize tobacco, cannabis, and marijuana in public places because such activities would be detrimental to the public health, safety, and welfare of the Township and its residents because of the migration of smoke and harm from second-hand smoke; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee finds that the limited resources of the Department of Public Works and Recreation Department can be conserved if smoking were to be banned from such public parks and recreation areas, by preventing the litter typically generated by smoking, such as cigarette or butts, ashes, used matches or lighters, and packaging; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee authorizes the imposition of fines or civil penalties may be imposed for the public smoking, vaping, or aerosolizing of tobacco, hemp, cannabis, and marijuana items.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, that the Code, Chapter 472 shall be amended as follows:

SECTION 1. Article I Sale to Minors, of Chapter 472 of the Municipal Code of the Township of Cranford, Article I, is hereby renamed “Sale & Consumption of Tobacco and Cannabis Products.

SECTION 2. Chapter 472 of the Municipal Code of the Township of Cranford, Article I, is hereby amended as follows:

§ 472-1 Violations and penalties.

- A. Any person who directly or indirectly, acting as agent or otherwise, sells, gives or furnishes to a minor under the age of ~~21~~¹⁹ years any cigarettes made of tobacco or of any other matter or substance which can be smoked or any cigarette paper or tobacco in any form, including smokeless tobacco, shall be punished by a fine of \$250.
- B. Smoking on municipal property (including but not limited to municipal buildings, parks, parking lots, and recreational areas) shall be prohibited. Any person smoking on municipal property shall be punished by a fine of \$250.

SECTION 3. Chapter 472 of the Municipal Code of the Township of Cranford, Article II, Section 5 is hereby amended as follows:

§ 472-5 Definitions.

For the purpose of this ~~Chapter~~^{article}, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this article clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number shall include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

BOARD

The Cranford Board of Health.

CANNABIS.

All parts of the plant Cannabis sativa L. within the plant family Cannabaceae, whether growing or not, the seeds thereof, and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds, except those containing resin extracted from the plant; which are cultivated and, where applicable, manufactured for use in cannabis products, in accordance with the Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act, P.L. 2021, c. 16 (N.J.S.A. 24:6I-31 et seq.).

ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE

An electronic or other powered device that can be used to deliver nicotine or other substances to the person inhaling from the device, including but not limited to an electronic cigarette, cigar, cigarillo, or pipe.

RETAIL ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE ESTABLISHMENT

EXPLANATION – Matter struck through ~~this~~ in the above ordinance is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter underlined this is a new matter.

Any establishment that sells or offers for sale electronic smoking device products designed for consumption through inhalation.

SALE

Every delivery of electronic smoking devices, whether the same is by direct sale or the solicitation or acceptance of an order, including the exchange, barter, traffic in, keeping and exposing for sale, displaying for sale, delivering for value, peddling and possessing with intent to sell.

SMOKING

The burning or aerosolizing of, inhaling from, exhaling the smoke from, or the possession of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe or other product which contains tobacco, cannabis, and any other matter that can be burned or aerosolized so as to be inhaled and exhaled as smoke or vapor.

SECTION 4. Severability. If any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to that portion of the ordinance actually invalidated and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.



WHEREAS, Father Charles Watters, who was an Air National Guard Chaplain during two tours of duty during the Vietnam War, also served at St. Michael Church in Cranford from 1964 through 1965; and

WHEREAS, during his second tour, Father Watters was killed on November 17, 1967 during a twelve (12)-day battle in the vicinity of Dak To, Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, unarmed and completely exposed, Father Watters rushed forward in the line of contact with complete disregard for his own safety to provide aid to wounded soldiers, to assist with evacuation efforts and to assist with Last Rites to the dying soldiers; and

WHEREAS, Father Watters was mortally wounded while giving aid to his comrades and awarded our nation's highest honor, the Congressional Medal of Honor, posthumously. Only a handful of chaplains have received this honor. Father Watters was buried at Arlington National Cemetery with full honors; and

WHEREAS, during Cranford Memorial Day Parades, the Cranford Knights of Columbus honored Father Charles Watters with a float depicting him ministering to a fellow soldier; and

WHEREAS, Father Charles Watters spent all of his life in Cranford, serving the people of his town, and then served his country and ultimately, gave his life; and

WHEREAS, as Father Watters served in Saint Michael Parish, it is fitting to memorialize him in the location near St. Michael Church; and

WHEREAS, Father Watters always put others needs before his own and was known for his willingness to help those in need and whose sacrifice and dedication to the community have been recognized by the Veterans of Foreign War (VFW), the Cranford 86, and Saint Michael Church; and

WHEREAS, Cranford residents Gracy Lyubarsky, Aashritha Jinaga, and Alexi Pryor of Girl Scout Troop No. 40222 focused their Silver Award Project on formally recognizing the Cranford 86 individuals with honorary street signs within the community, beginning with Father Charles Watters; and

WHEREAS, these Silver Award Candidates worked with the Cranford VFW, Saint Michael Church, the Cranford Historical Society, the Cranford 86 Project Committee, the Cranford Police Department and the Cranford Knights of Columbus to organize an effort to dedicate a Township Road to Father Watters; and
