### <u>New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) – Division of Water Quality</u> - NJPDES (New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) Permit Fees

Township Consulting Engineer Carl O'Brien provided an update about the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Division of Water Quality New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NJPDES) Permit fees, and specifically noted that the "Elimination" fees would increase in 2023. Mr. O'Brien stated that he would apprise Township professionals of the increased fee effective date.

# State of New Jersey-mandated Flood Ordinance

Township Consulting Engineer Carl O'Brien spoke about the proposed Township Committee timeline of the State of New Jersey-mandated flood ordinance, i.e., introduce the ordinance in March and adopt the updated ordinance in April. He spoke about the components of the ordinance and expected ordinance work with the Township's Consulting Engineers and the Building Department. A brief discussion ensued.

On motion of Deputy Mayor Gareis, seconded by Commissioner Black and passed, the Township Committee moved to conduct the Official Meeting at 8:18 p.m.

On motion of Commissioner Miller Prunty, seconded by Commissioner Curran and passed, the Township Committee returned to open session at 9:10 p.m.

# **Budget Workshop Meeting Follow-up**

Chief Financial Officer Lavona Patterson spoke about the 2023 Township Budget. She noted that the Township's Budget was under "State Review." Ms. Patterson stated that the Township Committee was expected to introduce the Budget at its March 21<sup>st</sup> Official Meeting. Discussion then ensued regarding 1) the Township's surplus, 2) the decline in certain Township revenue figures and 3) expected strains on the Budget.

# Westfield YMCA and Cranford Pool & Fitness Center

The members of the Township Committee discussed next steps in regards to the proposed relationship with the Cranford Pool & Fitness Center and the Westfield YMCA, the recent Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) communication to pool members, current use at the Cranford Pool & Fitness Center during the hours between 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m., membership, other communities' experience with municipal pools and the need for another FAQ document.

# Cranford Recreation facility at 375 Centennial Avenue Formal Opening

Commissioner Gina Black and Recreation Director Steve Robertazzi spoke about the formal opening planned for the new Recreational Facility at 375 Centennial Avenue, noting that it would occur on the upcoming Saturday and would include Honor Guard participation, Lacrosse and Soccer program participation, refreshments and speakers. A brief discussion ensued.

### Year-End Township Tax Statement

Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Lavona Patterson spoke about the Township's Year End Tax Statement and provided an overview of where the taxes are distributed (i.e., the Board of Education and the Library). She also reviewed the Township's tax levy and collection rate.
