WHEREAS, the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, New Jersey (the "Township") intends to issue an \$80,000 Bond Anticipation Note, dated September 9, 2016, payable September 8, 2017 (the "Note"); and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to designate the Note as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, New Jersey, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The Note is hereby designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said Note is not a "private activity bond" as defined in the Code and (2) the Township and its subordinate entities, if any, do not reasonably anticipate issuing in excess of \$10 million of new money tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds) during the calendar year 2016.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. It is further determined and stated that the Township has, as of the date hereof, issued the following tax-exempt obligations (other than the Note) during the calendar year 2016, viz:

SECTION 4. The Township will, to the best of its ability, attempt to comply with respect to the limitations on issuance of tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code; however, said Township does not covenant to do so, and hereby expressly states that a covenant is not made hereby.

<u>SECTION 5</u>. The issuing officers of the Township be and they hereby are authorized to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the original purchaser of the Note and to further provide such original purchaser with a certificate of obligations issued during the calendar year 2016 dated as of the date of delivery of the Note. SECTION 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Kalnins opened the public comments portion of the meeting and asked if there were any questions or comments.

John Pritchard, 42-44 West Holly Street, discussed the loss of Cranford residents in the Vietnam War. Feels the Vietnam Veterans were not supported. Sang a song in support of the military. Discussed the 15th Anniversary of 9/11. Feels Muhlenberg and other hospitals need to be reopened due to Cranford's proximity to Ground Zero and requested that the Township Committee urge legislators to reactivate these hospitals.

<u>Phyllis Howard, 5 Burnside Avenue</u>, thanked the Township Committee for introducing the ordinance regulating twenty-four (24) hour business operations within residential areas. Requested clarification as to how it would be enforced.

Mayor Kalnins stated that the ordinance takes effect upon adoption.

Township Attorney Dabulas explained that these regulations would be handled under general ordinances and discussed the departments involved with enforcement.

Ms. Howard referred to a comment by Deputy Mayor O'Connor concerning people's attraction to Cranford and stated that she agrees with Deputy Mayor O'Connor. Feels the regulations concerning twenty-four (24) hour businesses will help Cranford to keep its quaint character.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Kalnins closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

PROFESSIONAL COMMENTS - None

COMMISSIONER REPORTS/COMMENTS

Commissioner Thomas H. Hannen, Jr.

- Thanked Commissioner Giblin for his insistence that the Orange Avenue paving project move forward to ensure its completion before the start of school;
- Discussed the Community Rating System and announced that a Class 7 rating was granted to Cranford, which allows for a fifteen (15%) percent reduction in flood insurance premiums. Further stated that the Township Committee has directed the Township Administrator to begin investigating the actions necessary to obtain a lower rating, which would allow for a higher discount in flood insurance premiums. An update as to the status would be provided within the next sixty (60) days. Also commended the Flood Advisory Committee for their efforts with this program and provided contact information for those with questions or seeking additional information;
- Discussed the 9/11 Ceremony and commended the 9/11 Committee and all involved for their efforts. Extended his thoughts and prayers to all families who lost loved ones on September 11th.

Commissioner Patrick Giblin

- Discussed the 9/11 Ceremony and commended all involved for their efforts;
- Welcomed students back to school and reminded residents to drive carefully. Thanked the Superintendent of Schools and the Board of Education for their efforts in keeping Cranford's school system excellent;
- Referred to Commissioner Hannen's comments concerning the Community Rating System and the fifteen (15%) percent reduction in premiums for Cranford residents. Also discussed the Township's continued efforts to attain an even lower rating, which would result in a larger reduction in flood insurance premiums;
- Announced that the Centennial Village Group would be hosting its annual Music Fest and provided contact information for those interested in attending;
- Announced that Cranford Project Home would be hosting its annual Town-wide Garage Sale on October 1, 2016. Provided contact information for those interested in participating;
- Discussed the installation of turf field and fundraising being held by the Cranford Soccer Club to help raise funds in connection with this project;
- Discussed the Feast of St. Michaels and encouraged residents to support the event.

Commissioner John V. Mallon

- Provided an update of the Walnut Avenue Pedestrian Safety Project and announced that work should commence tomorrow, with a slight disruption to commuters;
- Discussed the Cranford Newsletter that was mailed to residents and stated that it contains a map of the roadways included in the 2016 Paving Project. Discussed Township funding of the 2016 Paving Project, as well as paving that would be done at the expense of utility companies. Discussed the schedule for paving and assured residents that those who would be impacted would be notified. Explained that the Township Engineer and the Department of Public Works is constantly reviewing roadways to determine those which need to be placed on a list for future paving projects. Requested that residents who feel their street should be considered for paving contact the Township;
- Discussed a meeting he attended in Trenton with Deputy Mayor O'Connor and the Township Engineer regarding the Orchard Brook Flood Mitigation Project. Feels the meeting was productive and is hopeful

that it will continue to move forward. Also stated that direction from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) as to the next step would be provided;

• Discussed Phase 2B of the Flood Control Project and stated that the Township is awaiting DEP's final approval before the project is advertised for bids.

Deputy Mayor Mary O'Connor

- Thanked those in attendance at the 9/11 Memorial Service and commended everyone involved. Referred to Mr. Pritchard's comments and thanked him for reminding the community to "never forget" the loss this country endured that day;
- Announced that the Cranford Juvenile Division is raising funds to replace the Officer McGruff costume that was lost during Hurricane Irene. Explained that the McGruff program is a child-friendly program that teaches students about home and school safety, and to use safe practices when exploring the internet. Provided information for anyone interested in donating funds;
- Announced that the Pedestrian Safety Walkable Community Town Hall Meeting would be held at the Cranford Community Center on October 6, 2016. The Township is in the process of creating an online survey for public input. More information would be available on the Township website;
- Discussed pedestrian improvements scheduled for Walnut Avenue and explained that the project involves the installation of a lighted crosswalk to provide additional visibility for pedestrians. Cautioned drivers to slow down while driving through that area because it is an active pedestrian area;
- Discussed her attendance at a meeting with DEP with respect to the Orchard Brook Flood Mitigation Project. Assured residents that the Township is looking for a project design that works best for residents and Cranford as a whole, and is hopeful that another Town Hall meeting would be scheduled regarding the project;
- Discussed the Cranford Newsletter and the information it contains. Suggested that residents save the magazine because it provides information that is useful through the end of the winter season;
- Discussed the Centennial Village Music Festival and encouraged residents to support the event;
- Announced that the St. Michael's Feast would be held on September 22, 2016 and encouraged residents to support this event as well.

Mayor Andis Kalnins

- Discussed the Community Rating System, which becomes effective October 1, 2016, and announced that more information would be provided through the Township's website and mailings. Explained that most communities initially receive a rating that allows for a five (5%) percent reduction in flood insurance premiums, but Cranford was able to obtain a rating that allows for a fifteen (15%) reduction. Discussed the Flood Control Advisory Board's original involvement with this initiative, and recognized the efforts of Ed Trush and Lou Lambe, who presented a proposal to the Township Committee concerning this program back in 2012;
- Discussed the Chamber of Commerce's Networking Event to be held September 14, 2016 and the topics scheduled for discussion. Provided information for those interested in attending;
- Discussed the User-Fee Based Residential Cleanup Program (bulky waste) and explained that there would be no program in the fall because no bids were received from haulers. Announced that the Township intends to re-bid the project in an effort to restart the program in the spring. Provided current options available to residents needing to dispose of bulky waste items;
- Discussed the 9/11 Memorial Ceremony and feels it was well attended. Thanked everyone involved in coordinating the event. Feels Cranford is a community that stands out and comes together and stated that it is a privilege to serve Cranford.

On motion of Commissioner Hannen, seconded by Deputy Mayor O'Connor and passed, the Township Committee adjourned at 8:32 PM.
