Resolution No. 2019-133:

RESOLUTION DIRECTING PLANNING BOARD TO CONDUCT DECENNIAL REEXAMINATION OF MASTER PLAN

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2009, the Cranford Township Planning Board adopted the current Township of Cranford Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40-55D-89, the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford shall, at least every ten years, provide for a general reexamination of the Master Plan and development regulations by the Planning Board; and

WHEREAS the Planning Board has not conducted such a reexamination since the September 30, 2009 adoption of the Master Plan;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranford, in the County of Union, New Jersey does hereby direct the Planning Board to conduct a general reexamination of the Master Plan and development regulations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, at the conclusion of the reexamination, the Planning Board prepare and adopt by resolution a report on the findings of such reexamination; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall state:

a. The major problems and objectives relating to land development in the Cranford at the time of the

- adoption of the Master Plan.
- b. The extent to which such problems and objectives have been reduced or have increased subsequent to the adoption of the Master Plan.
- c. The extent to which there have been significant changes in the assumptions, policies, and objectives forming the basis for the Master Plan or development regulations as last revised, with particular regard to the density and distribution of population and land uses, housing conditions, circulation, conservation of natural resources, energy conservation, collection, disposition, and recycling of designated recyclable materials, and changes in State, county and Township policies and objectives.
- d. The specific changes recommended for the Master Plan or development regulations, if any, including underlying objectives, policies and standards, or whether a new plan or regulations should be prepared; and
- e. the recommendations of the Planning Board concerning the incorporation of redevelopment plans adopted pursuant to the "Local Redevelopment and Housing Law," P.L.1992, c.79 (C.40A:12A-1 et al.) into the land use plan element of the Township's Master Plan, and recommended changes, if any, in the local development regulations necessary to effectuate the redevelopment plans of the Township.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Giblin opened the public comments portion of the meeting and asked if there were any questions or comments.

John E. Pritchard, 42-44 West Holly Street, feels residents should always remember those who served our country and those who were lost during war. Sang a song in support of the military, and urged the Township Committee to request that legislators reactivate Muhlenberg Hospital and other hospitals in the area due to their proximity to Ground Zero.

James Carvalho, 9 Orange Avenue, spoke about condemnation and the Township contemplating the acquisition of the properties through eminent domain. Feels there was a lack of communication between the Township and the property owners. Discussed a report that was posted on the Township website listing all the properties that were condemned which was publicly provided at the January 10, 2018 Planning Board meeting. Discussed campaign contributions made by outside vendors to Township Committee members and votes made awarding no-bid contracts to the contributor. Explained how Pay-to-Play affects the Township Committee and the Planning Board. Discussed a no-bid contract awarded to Harbor Consultants to serve as the Township's Planner specific to the rezoning application for 750 Walnut Avenue. Mentioned that the principal owner of the company owns private property adjacent to 750 Walnut Avenue which gives the appearance of a conflict of interest. Spoke of another no-bid contract awarded to the same consultant to produce and present the current affordable housing plan which suggests the sale of Township property on Myrtle Street to help meet the affordable housing requirements. Mentioned another property that was sold on Myrtle Street to Harbor Consultants without any affordable housing requirements. Feels the perils of Pay-to-Play need to be addressed.

Commissioner Hannen clarified that he did not use any funds from the Local Democratic Committee for his campaign.

Barry O'Donovan, 710 Orange Avenue, also Downtown Business Owner, spoke about a proposed bill from the State to create liquor licenses called "R licenses". These licenses are renewed annually and will permit any business to have a liquor license without a bar. Discussed the requirements and mentioned that the town is responsible for issuing the license. All restaurant and bar owners are concerned how their businesses will be affected. Explained that the State will give a five-year tax abatement on liquor licenses to cover the renewal cost. It will be impossible to sell liquor licenses if this bill is enacted. Spoke about the depreciation of the existing liquor licenses and an increase in tax appeals. Discussed the dangers with creating more liquor licenses because it will create more drinking and DUIs. Feels Cranford needs to keep its residents safe. Commended the Township Committee for serving the community. Looks forward to being proactive instead of reactive with the R License initiative.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Giblin closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

- Had the opportunity to attend the Downtown Management Corp. (DMC) meeting. Met with the downtown business owners and volunteers which he feels are a testament to the Township;

- Announced that the 2019 Capital Budget meeting will be held on Monday, February 25, 2019.

- Discussed campaign contributions which are public record. Has always filed her reports. Stated that the only thing that influences her is what is best for Cranford and its residents;
- Offered condolences to the Schwartz family and the extended family in the Cranford Police Department.

Commissioner Thomas H. Hannen, Jr.

- Discussed the opening of the Cranford Dramatic Club production of Mama Mia. Encouraged residents to attend;
- Expressed condolences to the Schwartz family. Ray will be missed.

• Announced that the Cranford Police Department has been designated the third location in the Clear Program which stands for Community Law Enforcement Addiction Recovery. It's a partnership between law enforcement and social services to assist in opioid and other drug addictions. Cranford has 12 officers trained in advanced addiction recovery assistance. Provided contact information for public.

Mayor Patrick Giblin

- Wished National Guard Member Captain Dolton, who is also a Cranford resident, safe travels overseas in protecting the African straits;
- Announced that the 2019 Capital Budget meeting will be held February 25, 2019 and will be open to the public;
- Commended Police Chief Greco and Detective D'Ambola and all the public safety members that showed compassion to Ray Schwartz over the years. Expressed condolences to the Schwartz family;
- Announced the production of Mama Mia through the Cranford Dramatic Club. There will be a special cameo on March 1, 2019;
- Thanked Barry O'Donovan and the other tavern owners for attending tonight's meeting and bringing the R License issue to the Township Committee's attention. Appreciates the concerns that were expressed.
